

## How to measure for a halter

Halters made by different manufacturers will fit differently....so you'll want to do a little measuring. Estimate where the nose band should be, usually a little over  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{2}{3}$  of the way up between the donkeys's nostrils and eyes (just in front of the cheekbone). Using a tape measure or string, measure around the nose. Record the *nose measurement*. Starting at the side of the donkey's face where the nose band would lay, measure from one side to the other, laying the tape along the donkey's cheek, over the poll and to the other side. Record the *crown measurement*.

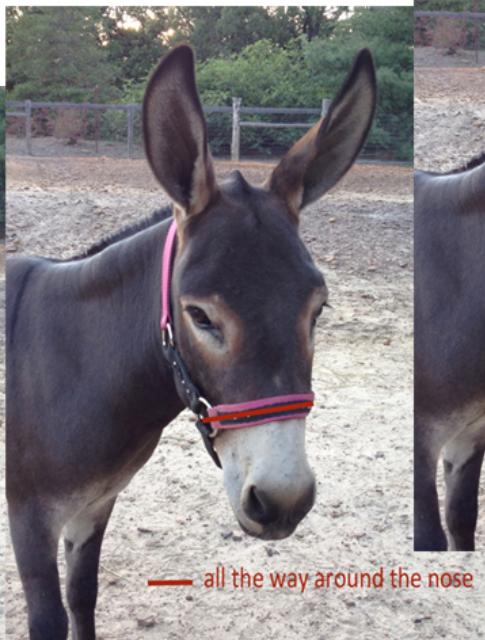
We all know that God made minis special and that each one is unique. Therefore, if you prefer to send measurements to us for a custom fit (as opposed to our standard sizes) we prefer snug measurements. We will allow a couple of inches where necessary for comfort.

Once you receive your halter and put it on, the nose band should not be too snug. You want your donkey to be able to eat and drink comfortably. Make sure the halter isn't binding. The throatlatch should not droop down too far, but you should be able to fit two or three fingers between it and the donkey's jaw. It's important that it isn't so loose that the donkey is able to get a foot through when it decides to scratch with a hind foot or that it dangles making it possible to catch on something.
